The Baguley Hall


Constructed in the 14th century for the de Baguley family, Baguley Hall is one of England's oldest surviving timber great halls. The oversized plank construction is believed to be connected to Danish Viking boathouse construction. Gifted to Manchester Corporation and used a council workshop and store between 1927 and 1968 the building was eventually passed into state ownership. The Grade I listed building now remains disused but is maintained by English Heritage.

This project aims to help our external partner seek the future possibilities of the Baguley Hall to make it a community centre for the locals. Baguley Hall, an important memory that grows up with almost everyone in this area, needs our help to bring it back to the neighbourhood's daily life. We are going to propose a café, a museum, or a gallery that could gather everyone together in this amazing historic building, passing it through more and more generations.

In this two-week project, we divided the whole group into five teams to come up with five different proposals. By visiting the site and having meetings with our client and the experts who have knowledge of the Baguley Hall and historic building conservation, the students get to know the site and develop their proposals with sketches and drawings to propose a sustainable future of the Baguley Hall.




UK GOVERNMENT POPULATION ESTIMATES [ADAPTED FROM ONS, ACCESSED 20/05/2022]






Our group proposal is to introduce the concept of the "box" into the Baguley Hall. By putting modular boxed into the interior helps protect the original building and, at the same time, allows the building manager to make changes without harming the original contents.








Initial Plan







Our design for repurposing the Baguley Hall touches on multiple aspects of the original building. The central rooftop was replaced with glass to introduce more sunlight, and an additional glass box is added to extend the cafe area. The programme will include a small community cafe, a gallery and workshops, to make sure the hall is multifunctional and meaningful to the surrounding community. Also, the green space surrounding it would have a stage built for events, and a garden with small ponds and a sitting area would also be introduced. Overall it would be a hall that the community wants to go to and be beneficial.






















PROJECTION OF THE ORIGINAL BAGULEY HALL


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


